1 Corinthians 13: 13

What exactly is biblical love???

- † Love is wanting what is best for, helping out, giving to and doing what will benefit another person regardless of whether you get anything out of it in return. Love will help out and do good for another person even when you don't get the credit for doing it.
- † Biblical love is not how you feel about someone but choosing to act in their best interest, even if it is a sacrifice for you.
- † The opposite of biblical love is not hate – the opposite of biblical love is selfishness!

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
